Overview

- **Geographical focus** Mumbai, Mumbai Suburbs and Thane through direct services and national and international through trainings
- **Reach** Over the last 10 years, Arpan has directly reached out to over 80,000 children and 100,000 adult stakeholders through its services of prevention and intervention, and a further 460,000 individuals through trainings
- **Resources** Team of over 85 social workers, counselors & other professionals; Operating annual budget INR 5.5 crores



Personal Safety Education (PSE)
- An innovative method to empower children and adults with adequate knowledge and skills to prevent child sexual abuse

participate in their own safety


Provide children with ageappropriate information, and build their self-esteem Contraction of the second seco



Outreach of the Programme by Arpan since 2007



Directly taught PSE to 80,000 Children

Created awareness amongst 58,000 Parents and Teachers

In over 140 Schools, (including 34 govt. schools)

Handled 6500 disclosures (8%)

Long Term Outcomes

External evaluation by IMRB (International Market Research Bureau, India) conducted with 620 students across Grades 1-7 in 9 schools where Arpan had already carried out the programme mapped the following long term Impact:

- Increased reporting and help seeking by children 8% children reported having faced unsafe situations. 90% of those who faced an unsafe situation were able to seek help from an adult.
- Knowledge retention 60-90% recall of top 5 safety concepts
- Benefits of integrating the programme -Institutionalised schools have a significantly higher recall as compared to schools with one-time intervention.
- 100% kids spoke about the program after attending it. Among this, 75% spoke to their mother about this.
- 100% kids said that they would want to attend the program again

Integration of Personal Safety Education in Schools: A case Study – Key Findings

- Children demonstrated increased help-seeking behaviour
- Children have internalised the Personal Safety Education messages which boosted their self esteem and articulation of feelings. They believe themselves to be active participants in ensuring their safety.
- Teachers are well aware of signs and symptoms of Child Sexual Abuse and are proactive in responding to a child's disclosure.
- Both Parents and teachers recognise Personal Safety Education Programme as a systematic age-appropriate model
- Parents are aware of Child Sexual Abuse and accept that known people can be abusers
- Parents believe the programme aids their communication with children on personal safety.

Personal Safety Education – A Replicable Program through Training and Digitalisation






Personal Safety Education – A Replicable Program

Arpan has introduced an intensive 5 day training of teachers/ trainers project which aims at building the capacity of teachers, school management and institutional trainers in undertaking PSE Program implementation at their school or organizational/ institutional level.


Arpan works along with the school/institutional management to incorporate the PSE module within their existing school or institutional curriculum/services.

Developing alternative tools like workbooks, story books, puppet kits, skits etc. are also a strategy Arpan has focused on in order to reach out to a larger and diverse population of children across geographical and socio-cultural set ups.

The Next 3 years

- Conduct the Personal Safety Education programme and work with 25,000 children every year – Total 75,000 children
- Increase investment in Training and Advocacy to leverage the external environment – Initiated work with MHRD and NCERT
- Continuous Resource development Develop Pre primary modules, modules for special children
- Scale through digitalisation of resources and test efficacy
- Invest considerably in Monitoring & Evaluation to make our current data capturing mechanisms more robust and conduct evaluations to test efficacy of programmes
