



Counter to public of juvenile crimes down


In 2016...

7717 cases of theft involving 10139 children of all age groups comprise the largest segment of juvenile crimes, followed by criminal trespass and burglary @2747 cases involving 3812 children.

2504 children have been apprehended in 1903 rape cases as against 1841 apprehended for 1688 cases in 2015.

1198 children in the 16 to 18 year age category are apprehended for kidnapping and 1561 for rape.

Most CICL are first time offenders and recidivism or repeat offending has been on a decline.





Contrary to popular belief, children who offend don't walk away free.

In 2006, 91% were held guilty despite the law being lenient in public perception.

In 2016, 86% are held guilty and pendency has increased.

In 2015...

- 42.4% CICL belonged to the families whose annual income was up to ₹25,000
- 28.2% CICL were from families with income between ₹25,000 and ₹50,000
- 25.9% CICL were from families with an income of ₹50,000 ₹2,00,000

Crime in India 2016 does not provide the economic status of the families of CICLs.
